

**GIDP ENTOMOLOGY AND INSECT SCIENCE  
LABORATORY ROTATION (EIS 700)**

- Each student must take two or more research rotations, which count towards the 36 units of EIS courses, in the first year in the Program. At least one of these rotations must be conducted in a laboratory other than that of the student’s advisor.
- The required course, **Methods in Entomology and Insect Science (EIS 700)**, provides a formal mechanism for these rotations (Use the rotation host’s section number for registration). You may enroll in a maximum of three units of rotation credit per semester. Each rotation is 8 weeks in duration, with about 10 hours of work expected per week in the lab.
- Although EIS 700 provides a formal mechanism for laboratory rotations, there is no set format for a given rotation project. Rotation projects should be designed by both the student and the rotation host to achieve specific goals for student development and expected outcomes from the project.
